




## Welcome to the World

**M** issionary and author Elisabeth Elliot says our sovereign God is worthy of unquestioning obedience in large and small matters. Such trust yields mighty results, she adds, providing Christians with rest, peace and guidance.

"God is God," says Elliot. "Because he is God, he is worthy of my trust and obedience. I will find rest nowhere but in his holy will that is unspeakably beyond my largest notions of what he is up to."

About the role of obedience in prayer, Elliot asks, "Does it make sense to pray for guidance about the future if we are not obeying in the thing that lies before us today? How many momentous events in Scripture depended on one person's seemingly small act of obedience? Rest assured: Do what God tells you to do now, and, depend upon it, you will be

shown what to do next."
