Matthew 5:43-48 (ESV)

Love Your Enemies

⁴³ "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. ⁴⁶ For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? ⁴⁸ You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

2.	How does Jesus require His listeners to adjust their thinking (verse 44)? How does this change reinforce the general intent of Jesus' sermon?
3.	How does praying for our enemies change our heard towards them?
4.	According to verses 46-47, how should our conduct with our enemies differ from the world around us?
